Finally, State Legalizes Same-Sex Marriage

As it turns out, marriage is Adam and Steve.

It's also Beth and Jody, and John and Garrett, and Janet and Carol and all the couples who've been waiting for the state Supreme Court's decision in the landmark marriage equality case, Kerrigan et al. v. Commissioner of Public Health et al.

In a 4-3 vote Friday, the court legalized same-sex marriages in Connecticut, saying that segregating loving heterosexual and homosexual couples into different institutions straights to traditional marriage, gay men and lesbians to marriage lite, or civil unions — is discriminatory.

Separate, Justice Richard N. Palmer eloquently wrote, is not equal in this case.

The opinion is historic and fraught with emotion. Gay and lesbian couples (and their straight supporters) have chafed under the voke of less-than-full-citizenship. At an afternoon press conference, Anne Stanback, executive director of the state's marriage equality organization, Love Makes a Family, exulted that Connecticut can now honestly call itself the "Constitution State." Janet Peck, who with her partner Carol Conklin was among the eight couple-plaintiffs in the suit, said, "For 33 years, my heart has ached" for marriage. Jeffrey Busch, a plaintiff with his partner, Stephen Davis, said simply, "Today, it feels like the world has changed."

All along, their most vocal opponent, the Family Institute of Connecticut, has breathlessly said that homosexual marriage signals the end of civilization. That's just fear talking. Homosexuals already marry in California and Massachusetts, and


